COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK



Sunday 26 May Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday, also known as Holy Trinity Sunday, is celebrated a week after Pentecost Sunday in honour of the most fundamental of Christian beliefs—belief in the Holy Trinity.

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth.

Wednesday 29 May The Solemnity of Dedication

The dedication of our little church of St Mary's Harvington occurred on Sunday 2nd June 1985, 160 years after it first opened its doors as a parish church. As the anniversary falls on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) the event is celebrated today in according to liturgical convention.

Friday 31 May Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary This is a fairly late feast, going back only to the 13th or 14th century. It was established widely throughout the Church to pray for unity. The present date of celebration was set in 1969, in order to follow the Annunciation of the Lord and precede the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist.

Saturday 1 June Memorial of St Justin, Martyr

St Justin (+165) was a philosopher born in Samaria. A convert to Christianity, he was a passionate searcher for truth which he found in Christ. He then defended the Christian faith with his writings, notably 'Apologies' and 'Dialogue'. He was martyred in Rome during the reign of Marcus Aurelius.
