## COMMEMORATED THIS WEEKWEEK

#### Tuesday 11 June: Memorial of St Barnabas



St Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. The Holy Spirit destined him to a universal mission. It was Barnabas who introduced St Paul to the other apostles, paving the way for a broad apostolate which required the approval of the pillars of the Church. He was with St Paul on the first missionary journey and in the first Council of Jerusalem. After having converted many souls for Christ, Barnabus died a martyr for the faith. Thursday 13 June: Memorial of St Anthony of Padua

St Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) was born in Lisbon, Portugal. A Franciscan, he was known for his profound knowledge of theology and for his power of persuasion. His preaching carried him from the north of Africa to Italy and France. He is known as the 'Evangelical doctor' because he based all that he said on the texts of the gospels. He died in Padua.

**Saturday 15 June: Memorial of Our Lady on Saturday** On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when there is no obligatory memorial, an optional memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary is allowed.

This excerpt from Chapter V of the Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy, issued by the Holy See in December 2001, describes the Church's traditional dedication of Saturday to the Virgin Mary.

The chapter describes the importance of Mary, the mother of Jesus, in Catholic devotional life, including the Liturgy, and includes reflections on popular devotions to Mary, her feast days, and the Rosary.

Saturdays stand out among those days dedicated to the Virgin Mary. These are designated as memorials of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This memorial derives from Carolingian times (ninth century), but the reasons for having chosen Saturday for its observance are unknown. While many explanations have been advanced to explain this choice, none is completely satisfactory from the point of view of the history of popular piety.
