Apostleship

The SECOND COLLECTION at Mass on Sunday 14th July is for **The Apostleship of the Sea**, the organisation who serve seafarers from across the world, regardless of belief, nationality or race.

Stella Maris - Our Lady, Star of The Sea

'Stella Maris' is the name by which many seafarers also know the Apostleship of the Sea. It is an ancient title for Mary, the Mother of God, traditionally used by seafarers and others associated with the sea. Just as seafarers have traditionally depended on the stars for navigation, so they trust in the protection and guidance of Our Lady. Stella Maris is the patron of the Apostleship of the Sea.

Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Many are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and poorer mental health.

Sea Sunday on Sunday 14th July is when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea. Your support will make a big difference to seafarers and fishers in need. You can donate during the second collection in church or by visiting www.stellamaris.org.uk/donate, or by texting 'SEA' to 70460 to donate £5. This collection is vital to enable Stella Maris to continue its important work, so please give generously. Thank you.



Ukraine is the world's sixth-largest seafaring nation, accounting for 4% of the global seafarer workforce. Since the war began, Ukrainian seafarers haven't been able to leave Ukraine to join ships elsewhere because of martial law imposed on men between

18 and 60 years of age. Following on from earlier COVID restrictions, some seafarers haven't been able to work for a year, which means they can't earn money and support their families. With your support, Stella Maris stepped in to support the immediate needs of these seafarers and their families and have provided tens of thousands of pounds in vital aid to hundreds of families to help them through this difficult period. They have provided support such as mobile phone SIM cards, food, transport, and temporary accommodation. In addition, they have developed a programme of psychological support for Ukrainian seafarers and their families who have been affected by the war. This programme gives them access to professional psychologists who will provide essential mental health support.
